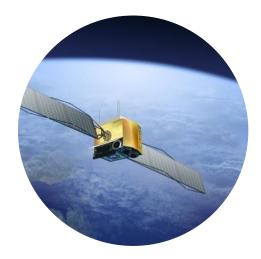

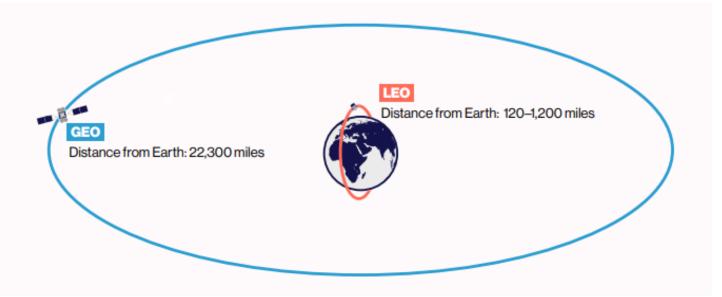
#### Main differences between GEO and LEO satellites

#### **GEO Satellites**

- Geostationary Equatorial Orbit
- ~ 36000 km
- Stationary above the same point on earth's surface
- Issues in polar regions (+/- 70 degrees latitude)
- High latency due to huge distance and RTT will be high ~ 500 ms

#### **LEO Satellites**

- Low Earth Orbit
- 160 2000 km
- Mega constellation for continuous global coverage
- Low latency 20 40 ms





#### New Satellite constellation enable RDT deployments

- High speed 50Mb/s 150 Mb/s
- Lower Cost
- 12000 satellites are already approved for 1<sup>st</sup> stage
- Easy to set-up



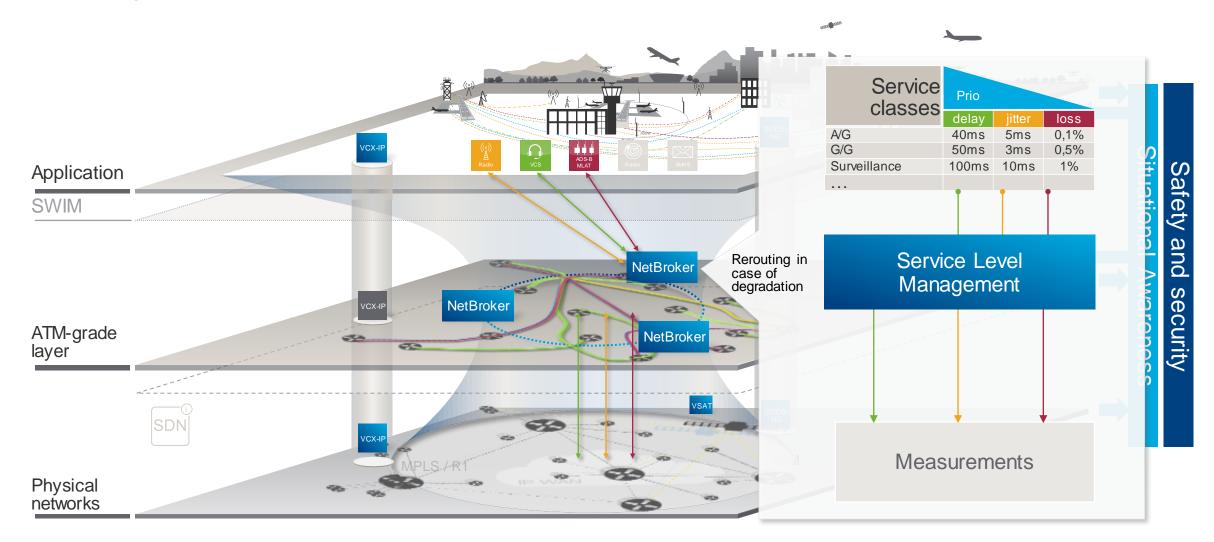






#### **ATM-Grade Intelligence**

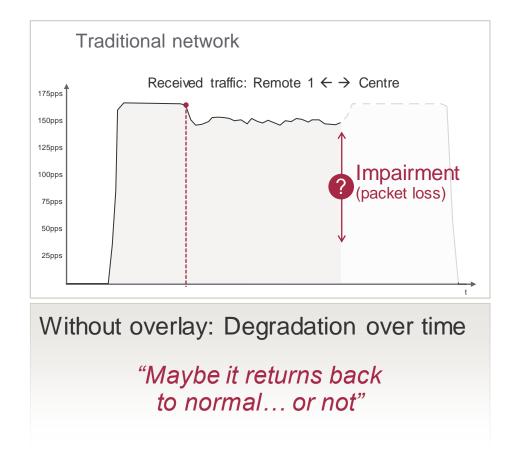

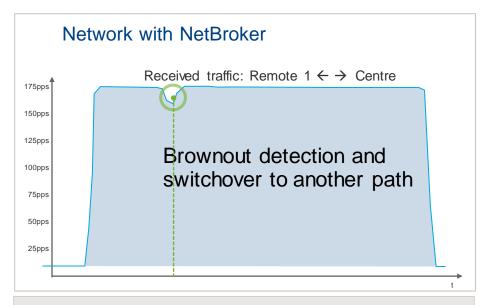

#### NetBroker senses degradation

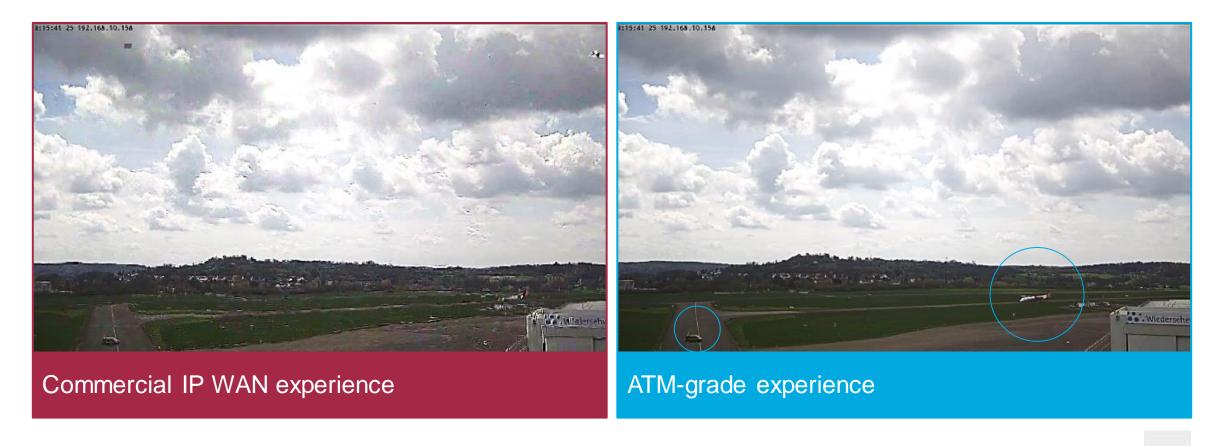

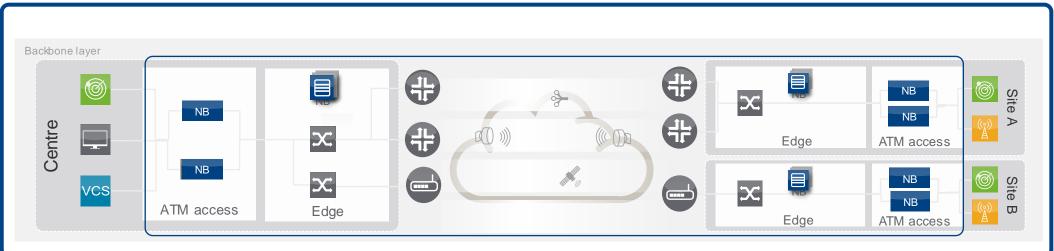


#### Situation ANSP operations | Typical monitoring in silos

Monitoring of ATM systems, applications and network in silos is a challenge and safety risk



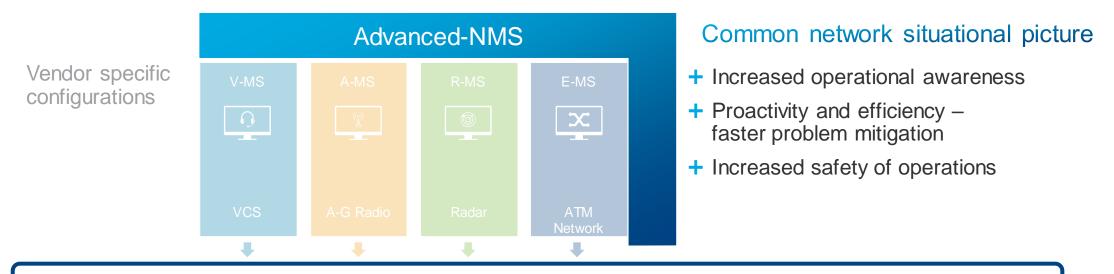
- Complex collaboration between units

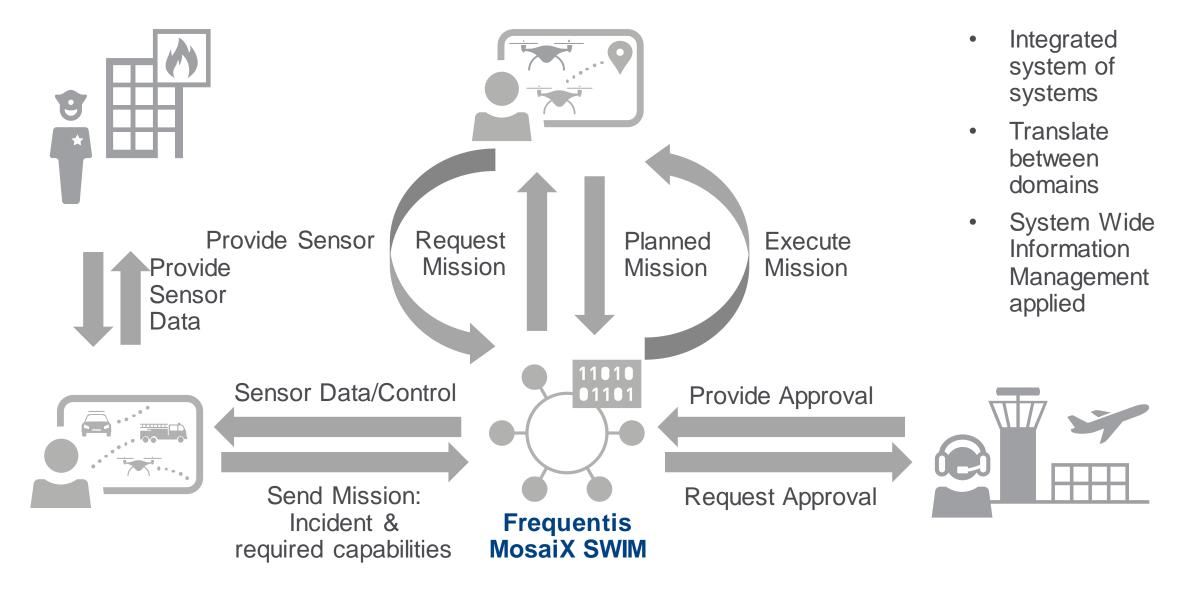
