



Our host, ASECNA, has kindly organised a fascinating tour of the Gorée Island on Friday 9 September.

Just 3.5km off the coast of Senegal, opposite Dakar, Gorée was, from the 15th to the 19th century, the largest slave trade centre on the African coast. Alternately under Portuguese, Dutch, English and French rule, its architecture is characterised by the contrast between the dark slave quarters and the elegant houses of the slave traders. The island of Gorée remains a symbol of human exploitation and a sanctuary for reconciliation.

Today, Gorée is a pilgrimage for the entire African diaspora, a focal point for contact between the West and Africa and a space for exchange and dialogue between cultures through the ideals of reconciliation and forgiveness.

Catering outlets on the island are limited. Snacks and water will be provided, but you are also free to bring your own should you wish.


