

Press release: Peruvian airspace is operated by Jotron ATC radio and recording systems

Jotron's Ricochet recorders are in operation at 11 Peruvian airports, including Lima's Jorge Chavez International Airport (CORPAC headquarters). The Ricochet recorder ensures synchronized replay of ATC data and allows an unlimited number of channels to be recorded simultaneously.
