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### **FOREWORD**

With many regions of the world today well along the path to full traffic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic impacts, this report looks back at a time when we were in the middle of those challenges.

The year started with many regions in the grips of a surge in cases and ended with the onset of Omicron, a highly infectious but less severe variant that drove new travel restrictions and testing protocols. Airline capacity in 2021 was still well below prepandemic numbers. IATA reported total Available Seat Kilometers (ASK) of -48.8 per cent from 2019 levels. International traffic was even lower and largely stagnant on 2020, with ASK for the full year 2021 at 65.3 per cent lower than 2019 levels<sup>1</sup>.

As the industry works to settle into the new normal and to once again wrestle with capacity challenges driven by growth, there are still important lessons to be learnt from the developments during the COVID-19 period when traffic demand fell. To provide evidence to inform this and build a global picture of how Air Navigation Service Providers (ANSPs) were performing before, during and after the pandemic, we need data – and this is where the work of the CANSO Global Benchmarking Workgroup (GBWG) can help.

This year, CANSO delivers the thirteenth edition of the *Global Air Navigation Services Performance Report*, which now includes 48 ANSPs from all around the globe. The report is a key output of the work of the GBWG and acts as a tool for ANSPs to compare, contrast and identify good practices and best efforts in ANS performance, particularly in the areas of cost efficiency and productivity, which were severely impacted by the decline in traffic.

In this edition, we look back on the performance in 2021, how participating ANSPs were being affected by global events, and how it reflects in our key performance metrics.

I would like to thank the CANSO GBWG and all the participating CANSO members. I also thank EUROCONTROL for their support in increasing the scope, scale, and utility of our report. In addition, I would like to thank Egis for eleven years' of effort in data collection and analysis, and their continued dedication in supporting CANSO and the GBWG with this work.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### **COVERAGE**

The CANSO Global Air Navigation Services (ANS) Performance Report is produced annually by CANSO's Global Benchmarking Workgroup (GBWG) with the support of Egis. Through agreement with EUROCONTROL's Performance Review Unit (PRU), data regarding European Air Navigation Service Providers (ANSPs) taken from the ATM Cost-Effectiveness (ACE) Benchmarking Report has been included. ACE Report data collected by the PRU since 2002 is available on the ACE dashboard.

This year's report provides data for 48 ANSPs and contains performance indicators for 2021, along with trend data between 2017 and 2021.

In line with CANSO's ambitions for the *Global ANS Performance Report* to reflect a broader picture of performance, data provided by the CANSO Safety Intelligence Workgroup (SIWG) examining key safety metrics in 2021 has been included. Collaboration between CANSO workgroups aims to enable interdependencies between data to be analysed and ultimately drive better insights into the reasons behind performance trends.

# PANDEMIC RECOVERY AND ITS IMPACT ON KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

Analysis of how the ATM system performed during its recovery is complex, however, maintaining service and preserving safety remains a top priority for ANSPs. As governments eased travel restrictions and the demand for international travel returned, safety prevailed, with a reduction in the number of accidents seen during 2021, and an accident rate significantly below the five-year average<sup>2</sup>.

Increases in traffic drove a return to congestion in isolated locations and at specific peak periods of the day. As traffic began to rise, particularly during mid-2021, the costs per IFR hour, a metric that cumulates ANSPs costs and spreads those out over the total number of annual IFR flight hours the ANSP handles in its airspace, suggests improvement in financial performance for ANSPs, reducing by nearly 18 per cent during 2021 for continental ANSPs. This can largely be accredited to the decreases in other costs for continental ANSPs, falling by a similar margin. Most ANSPs saw a decrease in this KPI, however, those that saw increases in costs per IFR hour ranged from 15-92 per cent increases in year-on-year costs.

As in 2020, continuity of services was key for ANSPs, and therefore staffing levels must ensure that coverage can be met at all times. While 53 per cent of continental ANSPs saw a decrease in ATCO in OPS costs, the total ATCO in OPS costs rose by 7.9 per cent. Alongside this, annual working hours grew by 1 per cent, with 64 per cent of ANSPs demonstrating growth as the average grew from 1334 in 2020, to 1343 in 2021.

Despite the challenges from the recovery of the COVID-19 pandemic, ANSPs showed resilience in their ability to function during difficult times. However, financial indicators, particularly for oceanic ANSPs with a higher exposure to international traffic which remained depressed in 2021, show that the industry continued to suffer from the reduction in traffic. It is therefore necessary to analyse these KPIs to ensure that the ATM industry, and indeed the wider aviation industry, is prepared for the future.

It is important to note that the reporting periods for ANSPs submitting data to CANSO vary. Some include data within the 2020 calendar year, some for the 2021 calendar year and others include some of 2022. The PRU data for European ANSPs aligns with the 2021 calendar year. The impact of the varying reporting periods is more significant this year than ever due to the pandemic traffic restrictions. In account for this, the graphs representing the KPIs are ordered by reporting period. The earliest reporting period starts in April 2020 (for ATNS, which captures the major impact of the pandemic) and the latest reporting period ends in June 2022 (Airways NZ, which captures more of the pandemic recovery period).

#### Key findings of the report<sup>3</sup>

Cost Efficiency (Indicator 1)

#### Continental Cost efficiency slightly improves amidst a growth in traffic



With a slight increase in IFR traffic the Total cost per IFR flight hour in Continental airspace decreased by 17.4 per cent compared to 2020. However, the metric is still almost 70 per cent higher than in 2019.

The increase in global average total cost per IFR flight hour in Oceanic airspace was driven by NAV CANADA and Airservices Australia that reported a significant increase in 2021. Airservices Australia had a significant decrease in IFR flight hours while their total costs increased in 2021 compared to 2020. NAV CANADA has also reported a decrease in IFR flight hours, although less significant than Airservices Australia and hence their contribution was mostly driven by an increase (more than 100 per cent) of total costs in 2021. The rest of ANSPs shown a decrease in total cost per Oceanic IFR flight hour.

If we examine the fiscal years, most Oceanic ANSPs (although there are few) do not coincide with the year 2021; rather, they encompass a significant portion of 2020. This is likely causing a greater impact in the data for Oceanic compared to Continental.

Additionally, there might be another influencing factor for these ANSPs. In 2020, they incorporated a larger amount of data from 2019 compared to other ANSPs. This action would have lessened the influence on the data for the year 2020 compared to those ANSPs reporting on the calendar year, which is now being presented in the context of 2021.











The decrease in global average ATCO productivity in Oceanic airspace was driven by NAV CANADA and Airservices. This is because the ATCO productivity Key Performance Indicator (KPI) is based on IFR flight hours which significantly decreased for both ANSPs in 2021. The rest of ANSPs shown an increase in ATCO productivity in Oceanic airspace but due to lower traffic volumes and different reporting periods it does not balance out the average value.





### INTRODUCTION

#### COMPARING ANSP PERFORMANCE

Air navigation service providers (ANSPs) are responsible for managing global air traffic safely, efficiently, and cost-effectively. This includes managing and enhancing airspace capacity through improvements to infrastructure and technology and improving efficiency through a skilled and productive workforce and an innovative approach to airspace management.

The performance of the air navigation system impacts stakeholders throughout the aviation ecosystem. From boosting connectivity and minimising delays, to upholding the highest standard of safety in aviation, efficient, effective air navigation services are a critical component of a high-performance aviation industry. To that end, CANSO has devised benchmarking exercises that aggregate and review global performance accordingly.

Comparing and benchmarking key financial and productivity indicators enables ANSPs to make informed decisions when pursuing increased cost-effectiveness and productivity, without impacting safety – the industry's top priority. The understanding gained from benchmarking helps ANSPs to work together to address both their own performance and that of the Air Traffic Management (ATM) industry worldwide. The annual CANSO *Global ANS Performance Report* has served to highlight global performance trends for over 12 years.

#### MEASURING COST EFFICIENCY AND PRODUCTIVITY

Cost-efficiency and productivity are two key performance indicators of air navigation services that enable this monitoring of performance. They demonstrate how ANSPs are delivering value and serve as indicators of operational efficiency. The *CANSO ANS Performance Framework* identifies the factors that determine cost efficiency and productivity, including employment costs, hours worked and other costs, and is used to create a clear, common model for understanding global ANS performance.

# GLOBAL AIR NAVIGATION SERVICES PERFORMANCE REPORT

This year's *Global Air Navigation Services Performance Report* contains performance indicators for identified ANSPs for the year 2021, along with trend data between 2017 and 2021.

ANSPs submitting to CANSO have also provided contextual comments, including any exceptional events during the year or items that may impact the comparability of their data. Additional comments on important events are included within the contextual data, providing insight into the results of the participating ANSPs.

The detailed results for each ANSP can be found in the *CANSO Global Benchmarking Workgroup Performance Dashboard*, which is available to participating GBWG members.

#### INCORPORATION OF PRU DATA

A key objective for CANSO and the members of CANSO's GBWG is to continue to increase the global coverage of the data included in the annual *Performance Report*. To support this, for the fourth year, CANSO, with the agreement of EUROCONTROL, has incorporated public data collected by EUROCONTROL's Performance Review Unit (PRU) to complete the representation of European ANSPs in the dataset.

It should be noted that while the raw data extracted from the *ACE Report* is directly comparable, the final KPIs expressed in the CANSO report are not directly comparable to those reported in the ACE report.

Primarily, this is because the KPIs use different inputs. In particular, the CANSO report uses Instrument Flight Rules (IFR) flight hours and extracts "total flight hours controlled by the ANSP" as a comparable data point from the ACE dataset, while the ACE Report uses "composite flight hours". These comparable data points were validated as part of a comparison exercise undertaken by Egis, which was presented to the GBWG at GBWG/32 in Tokyo.

Differences in indicators between the two reports go beyond the use of a different flight hour measurement. Two key examples are highlighted below:

- CANSO's Performance Report converts all cost data into USD instead of EUR.
- CANSO's Performance Report primarily uses Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) as a source for exchange rate, inflation rate and purchasing power parity (PPP) information, whereas EUROCONTROL's ACE Report uses a combination of EUROSTAT and (International Monetary Fund) IMF data.

European GBWG members have been allowed to request, with justification, to use the GBWG submission for this benchmarking exercise. For further details please see *Global Air Navigation Services Performance Report 2017-2021: Participation*.

# IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON 2021 PERFORMANCE

## RECOVERY FROM THE PANDEMIC AND THE IMPACT ON TRAFFIC

This report focuses on 2021 performance data, however, the reporting periods of members' organisations are not all aligned. The performance data of those ANSPs that have reporting periods running from second half of 2020 or into the first quarter of 2022 may be differently impacted by the recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic and shift towards more 'normal' traffic.




Figure 1: Per centage change in aircraft movements by region, from Jan 2020 towards Jan 2022. Taken from CANSO ATM Traffic Analysis Report (January 2022)

With the exception of North America, Figure 1 illustrates that aircraft movements during 2021 remained generally below that of 2019, with aircraft movements declining by 15 per cent from 2019. This was largely due to the emergence of new COVID-19 variants and a peak in global cases during early 2021 across all the World Health Organization (WHO) reporting regions<sup>5</sup>. Europe saw the greatest decrease in aircraft movements, slipping by 62 per cent in movements compared to January 2020 during January 2021. As a result of relaxed domestic travel restrictions in Australia during early 2021, the Pacific saw a slight improvement to traffic numbers, however, the region remained well below January 2020 levels<sup>6</sup>. North America, on the other hand, saw only three months of traffic below that of January 2020 during 2021. Government 'stay at home' requests within China during early 2021 caused a significant reduction in traffic volumes at a time when demand increased, as demonstrated in Figure 1<sup>7</sup>.

The 2021 summer season brought about a period of increased travel demand for North America and Europe as a result of relaxed restrictions, resulting in aircraft movements exceeding January 2020 levels for the first time since March 2020. This was despite rising cases during August for the two regions, likely owing to the development of vaccinations and the increases in testing efficiency allowing domestic and parts of the international market to reopen. By the end of the year, most countries had at least partially re-opened borders, allowing for all markets, aside from Asia, to push significantly closer to a return to normality.

Towards the year end, most markets demonstrated some growth, nonetheless limited as a result of the Omicron variant of COVID-19. Markets in the Americas demonstrated the strongest recovery at the year end, with North America performing at only two per cent less than that of January 2020 in terms of movements. On the other hand, Asia presented the most stagnated growth through the year, peaking at 28 per cent less traffic than January 2020, and falling further to -51% during August.

# IMPACT OF COVID-19 AND VARIED REPORTING PERIODS

Similarly to previous reports, in collaboration with FAA-ATO we have indicated the reporting periods (fiscal years) of all ANSPs included in our data. As Figure 2 illustrates, the reporting periods for the ANSPs submitting to CANSO differ, with some ANSPs submitting data within the 2020 calendar year, and some reporting periods ending in 2022; European ANSPs submit data spanning the full 2021 calendar year. It is therefore inevitable that some trends displayed by ANSPs will be impacted inconsistently by the COVID-19 pandemic. Consideration should be made towards this, and thus, the KPI graphs have been ordered by reporting period, with the earliest month being April 2020 for ATNS, and the latest reporting period by Airways NZ in July 2022. While the majority of the submitting ANSPs have reporting periods during 2021, anomalous KPIs may be indicative of reporting period. For instance, in terms of Oceanic submissions, the majority of Oceanic ANSPs have financial years that are not aligned with 2021 but include a significant portion of 2020. Therefore, the data has more impact on the Oceanic ANSPs than the Continental ANSPs.

# CONTINENTAL COST EFFICIENCY AND PRODUCTIVITY: 2021

#### Indicator 1: Cost per IFR flight hour (USD)

Formula: Total costs/IFR flight hours




Figure 3: Cost per IFR flight hour (USD)

The 2021 median cost per IFR flight hour was USD 794. The 2021 weighted average (considering total continental IFR flight hours per ANSP) cost per IFR flight hour was USD 659. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2021 also provided continental data for 2020; the 2020 median was USD 938 and the weighted average was USD 643.

In terms of absolute total costs, 89.58 per cent of ANSPs saw a reduction of total continental costs with the median reducing by 18 per cent between 2020 and 2021.

It should be noted that differences between the operational characteristics of ANSPs' airspaces may significantly influence their 'Cost per IFR flight hour'. For example, skeyes and LVNL have delegated control of their upper airspace to MUAC. skeyes and LVNL therefore have a higher 'Cost per IFR flight hour', than if they controlled both, the upper and the lower airspace, as traffic for the latter is generally more complex. MUAC, meanwhile, makes use of infrastructure provided by skeyes and LVNL, which reduces its 'Cost per IFR flight hour'. Furthermore, since the upper airspace does not include VFR flights, MUAC's ATCO in OPS productivity is fully reflected in this KPI, while the values for skeyes and LVNL does include VFR workload, which reduces the ATCO in OPS productivity.

Specific ANSP comments are outlined below.

#### **ARMATS (Armenia)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For ARMATS, this reflects an increase in staff costs (+nine per cent, or +€0.4M resulting from payments of employee benefits, which had been suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic) as well as reporting of exceptional items (€1M) reflecting disposal of obsolete assets.

#### **ENAIRE** (Spain)

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For ENAIRE, there are reductions across all the cost categories with the most sizeable decrease observed for exceptional costs (-€24.5M), reflecting the fact that the transition period to IFRS accounting rules, which began in 2008 ended in 2020, and these exceptional costs are no longer included in the cost base.

#### **DFS (Germany)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For DFS, all cost categories decreased in 2021, with the main contributors being staff costs (- $\in$ 19.1M, or -2.3 per cent), non-staff operating costs (- $\in$ 10.4M, or -8.1 per cent reflecting savings achieved across most cost categories incl. training and mission expenses, facility management, etc.), depreciations costs (- $\in$ 5.9M, or -6.5 per cent) and the cost of capital (- $\in$ 3.4M, or -12.7 per cent).

#### **DHMI (Turkiye)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

In the case of DHMI, this primarily reflects a very large increase in the cost of capital (+84.6 per cent, or +€42.2M) resulting from the combination of a growing asset base and occurring during a period of a higher rate of return on equity, happening in the context of high inflation in 2021 (19.6 per cent).

#### **DSNA** (France)

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For DSNA, the decrease in ATM/CNS provision costs reflects reductions across all cost categories with staff costs (-€25.3M, or -2.8 per cent) and non-staff operating costs (-€10.0M, or -3.5 per cent) being the main drivers.

#### **HASP (Greece)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For HASP, increases are observed across most cost categories, with staff costs (+9.2 per cent, or  $+ \le 8.7 \text{M}$ ) being the main contributor. This reflects the fact that traffic volumes impact some elements of remuneration.

#### LFV (Sweden)

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For LFV, staff costs (-€81.8M, or -39.6 per cent) were the main driver for the observed reduction, chiefly reflecting lower pension costs in 2021.

#### **NATS (United Kingdom)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

In case of NATS, it reflects reductions across most cost categories with significant decreases recorded in exceptional items (-92.2 per cent, or - $\in$ 71.9M) and staff costs (-12.0 per cent, or - $\in$ 57.0M). These reductions are resulting from the implementation of a redundancy programme in 2020, which led to a lower headcount, thus positively affecting the staff costs in 2021. Another cost category which reduced significantly was non-staff operating costs (-51.2 per cent, or - $\in$ 60.6M), reflecting the release of provisions for bad debts for airlines recorded in 2020.

## Indicator 2A: ATCO in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour (USD)

Formula: ATCOs in OPS employment costs/ATCOs in OPS hours




Figure 4: ATCO in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour (USD)

The 2021 median ATCO in OPS employment cost per ATCOs in OPS hour was USD 111. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2020, also provided continental data for 2021; the 2020 median was USD 115.

ANSPs with reporting periods that begin in mid-2020 are likely to have been impacted by cost cutting measures owing to the pandemic, particularly by ANSPs implementing part-time work as a part of their staffing contracts. The reporting period for ATNS was most affected by the 2020 results, with 75 per cent of their reporting period being in 2020. This is seen in Indicator 3B, with a 29 per cent reduction in Annual Working hours per ATCO in OPS. MUAC typically has a higher cost due to the volume of flights operating in its operational upper airspace. LFV, the ANSP with the largest decrease in ATCOs in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour, was likely impacted by a lower level of traffic as well as a revenue reduction during 2021. KCAA demonstrated a 33 per cent increase in their ATCO costs, yet had a 43 per cent reduction in Cost per IFR hour. The Total costs for KCAA decreased by 50 per cent, despite ATCO Employment costs increasing by 1M USD. KCAA also saw an increase in IFR flight hours by 22.2 per cent, which also reduced Cost per IFR hour.

Specific ANSP comments are outlined below.

#### **ANS CR (Czech Republic)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

Similarly, ANS CR recorded a significant decrease in ATCO in OPS employment costs (-30.4 per cent, or -€9.1M), reflecting a continuation of cost-containment measures in 2021 including wage reductions, as well as postponement of bonuses and overtime payments.

#### **ARMATS (Armenia)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For ARMATS, the increase in ATCO employment costs is the result of certain 2020 cost containment measures being lifted in 2020 (mainly relating to the payment of bonuses/benefits to employees).

#### **DCAC Cyprus (Cyprus)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

The increase in ATCO employment costs for DCAC Cyprus, mainly reflects payments for overtime and promotions, as well as the increase in the number of ATCOs.

#### **DFS (Germany)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For DFS, a large part of the decrease in ATCO in OPS employment costs in 2021 is due to the significant reduction in the number of ATCOs in OPS (-152 FTEs), with the majority reallocated to non-operational duties (+105 FTEs).

#### **HASP (Greece)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

In the case of HASP, the increase in ATCO in OPS employment costs is driven by a combination of an increase in the number of ATCOs in OPS and in the average employment cost per ATCO hour.

#### LFV (Sweden)

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

In the case of LFV, the large reduction in ATCO in OPS employment costs (-37.9 per cent, or -€50.1M) is due to the significant decrease in pension costs.

#### NAVIAIR (Denmark)

The following justification is taken from the <u>ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition)</u>.

For NAVIAIR, the increase in ATCO in OPS employment costs is the combined effect of an increase in the number of ATCOs in OPS and higher average ATCO in OPS hours on duty per year.

#### **PANSA (Poland)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For PANSA, the observed decrease (-37.5 per cent , or - $\le 25.6 M$ ) mainly reflects decreases in salaries and other non-fixed parts of staff costs (bonuses, awards, etc.), impacted by cost-containment measures introduced in 2020.

## Indicator 2A: ATCO in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour (USD) – PPP adjusted




Figure 5: ATCO in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour (USD) – PPP adjusted

The 2021 median ATCOs in OPS employment cost per ATCOs in OPS hour, after PPP adjustment was USD 147. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2021 also provided continental data for 2020; the 2020 median was USD 138.

During 2021, Albcontrol had a larger reduction in staffing numbers relative to other ANSPs, perhaps indicative of their 23 per cent decrease in PPP adjusted ATCOs in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour. Isavia ANS received a greater volume of traffic during summer 2021, as did many ANSPs, thus increasing their staffing numbers to reflect this. PANSA also shows one of the largest decreases in PPP adjusted ATCOs in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour, reflecting a continuing of their cost containment measures from 2020, and the vast cost reduction methods targeted towards managing staffing costs.

#### Indicator 2B: ATCO in OPS hour productivity

Formula: IFR flight hours/ATCOs in OPS hours




Figure 6: ATCO in OPS hour productivity

The 2021 median ATCOs in OPS hour productivity was 0.48. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2020, also provided continental data for 2021 did so for 2020; the 2020 median was 0.38.

As featured in the 2020 report, MUAC maintained the highest productivity of all submitting ANSPs, again it should be noted that MUAC typical scope of services does not cover the more complex lower airspace, which helps to keep productivity high. Most ANSPs saw increased productivity during 2021, given that all, aside from ATNS, showed a decrease in Indicator 2B in the 2020 Report. ATNS saw the largest per centage decrease (43 per cent) owing to the bulk of the reporting period being subdued by COVID-19 restrictions, in comparison to the previous report reflecting more productive pre-pandemic figures.

## Indicator 2C: Cost excluding ATCOs in OPS employment costs per IFR hours (USD)

Formula: Costs excluding ATCOs in OPS employment costs/IFR flight hours




Figure 7: Cost excluding ATCO in OPS employment costs per IFR hours

The 2021 median cost excluding ATCOs in operations employment cost per IFR flight hour was USD 515. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2020, also provided continental data for 2021; All ANSPs submitting continental data for 2021 did so for 2020; the 2020 median was USD 645. In terms of absolute total costs, 89.36 per cent of ANSPs saw a reduction of continental costs excluding ATCOs in OPS employment costs with the median reducing by 18 per cent between 2020 and 2021.

The 85 per cent increase in Costs excluding ATCOs in OPS employment costs per IFR hour by ATNS was impacted by the reporting period starting in 2020 (which makes up the majority of the reporting period of ATNS in this report) when the IFR traffic was low. The cost reduction for KCAA is likely due to government spending cuts and subsequent cost cutting measures. All European ANSPs submitting to CANSO saw a decrease in costs per flight hour, as a result of increased traffic volumes during 2021. With skeyes infrastructure made available to MUAC as part of their agreements, and therefore, combined with the fact that skeyes provides services in the more complex lower airspace only, skeyes and LVNL (for similar reasons) typically have larger costs per flight hour. Airways NZ was the only ANSP, with a reporting period beginning in 2021, to show increased costs for the year, potentially as a result of their investment in their ANSP provision as described in Annex 4.

It should be noted that, for the same reasons stated in the description of Indicator 1 'Cost per IFR flight hour', differences between the operational characteristics of ANSPs' airspaces may significantly influence their 'Costs excluding ATCOs in OPS employment costs per IFR hour'.

Specific ANSP comments are outlined below.

#### **ANS CR (Czech Republic)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For ANS CR, there were reductions – across most support cost categories, with the most significant reduction observed in support staff costs (-23.1 per cent, or -€10.1M) reflecting a continuation of cost containment measures in 2021. These measures include the postponement of bonuses and payments for overtime, in addition to reductions in the following: wages; non-staff operating costs (-16.2 per cent, or -€2.5M); energy consumption; repairs and maintenance; travel expenses; costs of communication and other services.

#### LFV (Sweden)

The following justification is taken from the <u>ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition)</u>. In the case of LFV, the reduction in support staff costs (-42.7 per cent, or - $\in$ 31.8M), driven by large decrease in pension costs in 2021, more than compensated for the higher non-staff operating costs (+16.3 per cent, or, + $\in$ 4.8M) and cost of capital (+100 per cent, or + $\in$ 2.1M reflecting higher inflation in Sweden).

#### **NATS (United Kingdom)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition). With the exception of the cost of capital (+42.9 per cent, or +€14.7M), NATS was in a position to reduce all support cost categories through the implementation of various cost containment measures. The largest decreases are observed for exceptional costs (-92.2 per cent, or -€71.9M), non-staff operating costs (-51.2 per cent, or -€60.6M) and support staff costs (-21.5 per cent, or -€53.0M). As indicated above, NATS implemented a redundancy programme in 2020, which generated additional exceptional costs during its implementation but led to a lower headcount and subsequent reduction in staff costs for 2021.

#### NAVIAR (Denmark)

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition). For NAVIAIR, the observed decrease primarily reflects reductions in support staff costs (-28.1 per cent, or -€14.9M) and, to a lesser extent, in non-staff operating costs (-8.5 per cent, or -€2.0M) and the cost of capital (-15.9 per cent, or -€1.5M). The difference in support staff costs mainly reflects a significant reduction in support staff (-30 FTEs) over 2021 following the voluntary redundancy programme implemented by NAVIAIR in 2020.

#### PANSA (Poland)

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition). In the case of PANSA, reductions were observed in most support cost categories with the most significant reductions in support staff costs (-18.1 per cent, or -€10.8M) and, to a lesser extent, in non-staff operating costs (-11.3 per cent, or -€2.3M). These reductions reflect the continuation of cost containment measures introduced by PANSA in 2020.

Formula: ATCO in OPS employment costs/Total Costs




Figure 8: Employment costs of ATCOS in OPS as a proportion of total costs

In 2021, the median of the total ANS costs spent on employing ATCO in OPS was 30 per cent. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2021 also provided continental data for 2020; the 2020median was 29 per cent.

For most ANSPs, the year-on-year variation of Indicator 2D was up to 10 per cent. Of the European ANSPs, NATS had the largest variation (+28 per cent), potentially as a result a reduction in the cost base for exception items, as well as reduced staff costs during 2021, resulting from their redundancy programme in 2020. KCAA reported the proportion of total costs made up of ATCO in OPS employment costs as 0.46, which seemingly contradicts previous KPIs. This may have been impacted by increased staffing costs during a time of a significant reductions to Total costs (KPI 1).

#### Indicator 3A: Annual employment cost per ATCO in OPS (USD)




Figure 9: Annual employment cost per ATCO in OPS

The 2021 median unit ATCO in OPS employment cost was USD 139,103. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2020 also provided continental data for 2021; the 2020 median was USD 141,102.

NAV CANADA had the largest Annual employment cost per ATCO in OPS, rising by 51 per cent on the 2020 report figures. The lowest was LFV with a 36 per cent reduction on 2020, because of reduced pension costs. There were mixed results for ANSPs with reporting periods that began before 2021, with AEROTHAI falling the most (27 per cent) during this year. Growth, while limited, was demonstrated by ANSPs reporting after the start of 2021, indicative of a return to normality for ANSPs.

Specific ANSP comments are outlined below.

#### **ANS CR (Czech Republic)**

The following justification is taken from the <u>ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition)</u>. Similarly, ANS CR recorded a significant decrease in ATCO in OPS employment costs (-30.4 per cent, or -€9.1M), reflecting a continuation of cost-containment measures in 2021 including reductions in wages, postponement of bonuses and payments for overtime.

#### **ARMATS (Armenia)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For the ARMATS, the increase in ATCO employment costs is the result of lifting some cost containment measures implemented in 2020 (mainly relating to the payment of bonuses/benefits to employees).

#### **DCAC Cyprus (Cyprus)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

The increase in ATCO employment costs for DCAC Cyprus mainly reflects the payments for overtime and promotions, as well as the increase in the number of ATCOs.

#### **DFS (Germany)**

The following justification is taken from the ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition).

For DFS, a large part of the decrease in ATCO in OPS employment costs in 2021 is due to the significant reduction in the number of ATCOs in OPS, (-152 FTEs) following with the majority reallocated to non-operational duties (+105 FTEs).

#### **HASP (Greece)**

The following justification is taken from the <u>ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition)</u>. In the case of HASP, the increase in ATCO in OPS employment costs is driven by a combination of an increase in the number of ATCOs in OPS and in the average employment cost per ATCO hour.

#### LFV (Sweden)

The following justification is taken from the <u>ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition)</u>. In the case of LFV, the large reduction in ATCO in OPS employment costs (-37.9 per cent, or -€50.1M) is due to the significant decrease in pension costs.

#### **NAVIAIR (Denmark)**

The following justification is taken from the <u>ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition)</u>.

For NAVIAIR, the increase in ATCO in OPS employment costs is the combined effect of an increase in the number of ATCOs in OPS, and higher average ATCO in OPS hours on duty per year.




Figure 10: Annual employment cost per ATCO in OPS (USD)

The 2021 median unit ATCO in OPS employment cost, after PPP adjustment, was USD 190,676. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2020, also provided continental data for 2021; the 2020 median was USD 198,517.




Figure 11: Annual working hours per ATCO in OPS

The 2021 median annual working hours per ATCO in OPS was 1,346 hours. The differences recorded for in this metric were influenced by the number of staff working full-time. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2020, also provided continental data for 2021; the 2020 median was 1,341 hours.

NAV CANADA had the largest increase for this indicator with a 33 per cent year-on-year increase, owing to significant reductions in staff, as well as a partial return towards 'normal' traffic operations. ATNS reported the largest decrease in Annual Working hours per ATCO in OPS, partially owing to their increased hiring and vacancy filling during 2021. The largest decrease for European ANSPs was reported by ANS CR, likely as a result of their relatively large decrease in total staff number, which had been stable during previous years for this indicator. Several European ANSPs reported minimal change in their figures from 2020, suggesting success in maintaining staff provision alongside returning traffic.

Specific ANSP comments are outlined below.

#### Generic

The following justification is taken from the <u>ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition)</u>. It is important to consider that, the adjustment of ATCO-hours to quickly adapt to lower traffic levels, can be constrained by several factors which might be beyond ANSPs direct control.

#### **NAVIAIR (Denmark)**

The following justification is taken from the <u>ACE Benchmarking Report (2023 Edition)</u>.

For NAVIAIR, the increase in ATCO in OPS employment costs is the combined effect of an increase in the number of ATCOs in OPS, and higher average ATCO in OPS hours on duty per year.




Figure 12: Annual IFR hours per ATCO in OPS

The 2021 median annual IFR hours per ATCO in OPS was 568 hours. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2020 also provided continental data for 2021; the 2020 median was 473.

Nearly all ANSPs with reporting periods spanning 2021 saw an increase in Annual IFR hours per ATCO, demonstrating a recovery from the Pandemic and the subsequent increase in operations. For ANSPs submitting before 2021, these larger reductions are likely to originate as a result of their reporting period, for instance ATNS, who had this KPI reduce by five per cent in the previous reporting period, fell 59 per cent, explained by most of their traffic shortage captured in this period rather than the previous (2016-2020). Similar conclusions can be drawn from Airways NZ, who faced one of the most severe travel restrictions during the pandemic, through their two years of reduction in this KPI.

The 2021 median ratio of frontline service staff to ATCO in OPS was 1.00. The same ANSPs that submitted continental data for 2020, also provided continental data for 2021; the 2020 median was 1.16.

The largest increase in the Ratio of Frontline Service Staff to ATCO in OPS came from NAV CANADA at +17 per cent, and the largest decrease was demonstrated by LGS at -16 per cent, falling further than the -4 per cent change seen in 2020. ATNS saw a decrease in this ratio, likely as a result of growth in staff numbers during 2020. This was likely also as a result of their reporting period, being mostly in 2020 when restrictions were greater, and therefore, changes in support staff provisions to provide for the reduced volume of movements will have impacted this KPI.

#### OCEANIC COST EFFICIENCY AND PRODUCTIVITY: 2021

#### Indicator 1: Cost per IFR flight hour (USD)

Formula: Total costs/IFR flight hours




Figure 14: Cost per IFR flight hour

The 2021 median cost per IFR flight hour was USD 235 (for comparison, this figure for continental flights is USD 794). The 2021 weighted average (taking into account total oceanic IFR flight hours per ANSP) cost per IFR flight hour was USD 154. The same ANSPs that submitted oceanic data for 2020, also provided this data for 2021; the 2020 median for these ANSPs was 136 USD and the weighted average was USD 131.

Despite the three out of four ANSPs submitting oceanic data saw a reduction of total (oceanic) costs, the group median increased by 20 per cent between 2020 and 2021. This is driven by NAV CANADA's performance as they control the highest number of oceanic IFR movements.

All ANSPs included in this indicator have different reporting periods, making comparison of trends difficult for Oceanic ANSPs. However, it is typically seen that ANSPs with reporting periods starting later in 2020 or in 2021 (FAA-ATO, Isavia ANS and Airways NZ), experienced a decrease in the Oceanic cost per IFR hour. On the other hand, NAV CANADA saw a substantial increase in their Oceanic cost per IFR hour, increasing by over 200 per cent . This may be largely due to their reporting period covering 2020, thus skewing the trends on the graph. Another potential explanation for this may be that this is a result of investment into reducing aircraft minima over the oceanic routes, along with NATS (who did not submit for this data cycle). Similarly to NAV CANADA, with regards to earlier reporting periods, movements were affected more by restrictions in 2020, therefore reducing the IFR flight hours for the two ANSPs (where NAV CANADA will have been impacted greater by stronger restrictions in the USA, and therefore a fewer number of trans-Atlantic movements).




Figure 15: ATCO in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS

The 2021 oceanic median employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour was USD 145. For comparison, the 2021 figure for continental airspace is USD 111. DSNA did not submit during 2020 and there is therefore no CAGR and per centage change, however all other ANSPs who submitted during 2020 are present in this year's report; the 2020 median was USD 115.

All ANSPs submitting Oceanic data for this KPI experienced a growth, with the largest increase being demonstrated by Isavia ANS (13 per cent), and the smallest being Airways NZ (2 per cent). As with their continental data, Isavia ANS received a greater volume of traffic during summer 2021, alike many ANSPs, increasing their staffing numbers to reflect this. NAV CANADA likely showed an increase in this KPI as result of staffing cuts, as well as a reduction in OPS hours as a result of their reporting period. FAA-ATO appeared to normalise their figures, given their growth of 33 per cent in the previous years; FAA-ATO ATCO in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour was higher for oceanic than continental; an effect of the higher cost of living in the areas that cover oceanic traffic.




Figure 16: ATCO in OPS employment cost per ATCO in OPS hour – PPP adjusted

The 2021 Oceanic median employment cost per ATCO (PPP Adjusted) in OPS hour was USD 140; the median figure for continental airspace was USD 147. DSNA did not submit during 2020 and therefore there is no CAGR and per centage change, however all other ANSPs who submitted during 2020 are present in this year's report; for comparison, the 2020 median was USD 121.




Figure 17: ATCO in OPS hour productivity

The 2021 median ATCOs in OPS hour productivity was 1.58 IFR flight hours per ATCO in OPS hours, which is significantly higher than the continental figure of 0.48. The same ANSPs that submitted oceanic data for 2020, also provided this data for 2021; the 2020 median was 1.74.

NAV CANADA and FAA-ATO illustrate the impacts of the varied reporting periods. Isavia ANS and Airways NZ, both of which have reporting periods beginning in 2021, increased their ATCOs in OPS hour productivity. As before, NAV CANADA have both been affected by the earlier reporting period.

Formula: Costs excluding ATCOs in OPS employment costs/IFR flight hours




Figure 18: Costs excluding ATCOS in OPS employment costs per IFR flight hours

The 2021 median cost excluding ATCOs in operations employment cost per IFR flight hour was USD 152. The same ANSPs that submitted oceanic data for 2020, also provided this data for 2021; the 2020 median was USD 82.

In terms of absolute total costs, submitting ANSPs saw varying changes in oceanic costs excluding ATCOs in OPS employment costs, with the median increasing by 32 per cent between 2020 and 2021.

By far the largest increase was with NAV CANADA, likely resulting from the decrease in IFR hours on trans-Atlantic routes during 2020 (owing to their reporting period). FAA-ATO, Isavia ANS and Airways NZ all reduced in this KPI, largely owing to substantial increases during the previous year.




Figure 19: Employment costs of ATCOS in OPS as a proportion of total costs

The 2021 Median for the Proportion of Total costs made up of ATCO in OPS Employment costs was 32 per cent. The same ANSPs that submitted oceanic data for 2020, also provided this data for 2021; for comparison the 2020 median was 26 per cent.

As with the indicators previously, ANSPs with reporting periods closing earlier will have been more susceptible to COVID-19 impacts and travel restrictions, compared to those with reporting periods finishing at the end of 2021 or in 2022. NAV CANADA underwent staff reductions during their reporting period, and naturally, the proportion of total costs made up of ATCO in OPS employment costs reduced significantly by 42 per cent. In the case of FAA-ATO, whose proportion grew significantly year-on-year, it is the increased 2021 Oceanic flight hours which resulted in increased Oceanic ATCO Hours and thereby the Oceanic ATCO employment cost proportionally; all while 2021 Oceanic Total Costs decreased compared to 2020.




Figure 20: Annual employment cost per ACTO in OPS

The 2021 median of Annual ATCO in OPS employment cost was USD 214,439. There is no CAGR data point for DSNA, because they have only submitted ATCO employment costs since 2021, however all other ANSPs who submitted during 2020 are present in this year's report; for comparison the 2020 median was USD 145,810.

Most ANSPs submitting data for this KPI remained stable compared to the previous reporting period. However, this was not the case for NAV CANADA, who experienced significant increases (86 per cent) compared to other ANSPs. Part of this is likely to be as a result of a 39 per cent decrease during the previous year and subsequent recovery this year, in addition to the aforementioned staff reductions.




Figure 21: Annual employment cost per ATCO in OPS - PPP adjusted

There is no CAGR data point for DSNA because they have only submitted ATCO employment costs since 2021, however all other ANSPs who submitted during 2020 are present in this year's report; for comparison the 2020 median was USD 140,528.




Figure 22: Annual working hours per ATCO in OPS

The 2021 median annual working hours per ATCO in OPS was 1,340 hours and the 2020 median was 1,330 hours. DSNA and ATNS did not submit during 2020 and there is therefore no CAGR and per centage change, however all other ANSPs who submitted during 2020 are present in this year's report.

The ANSPs generally experienced minimal variation across reporting periods in Annual working hours per ATCO in OPS for Oceanic data, excluding NAV CANADA reporting a 68 per cent increase on their 2020 values. This was significant, both in terms of NAV CANADA's CAGR and in relation to the other Oceanic ANSPs. As with the other ATCO-related KPIs, such a variation may stem from the reduction of ANSP staff during the reporting period, particularly when benchmarking NAV CANADA against their previous reporting period – where they decreased by 30 per cent in the same KPI.




Figure 23: Annual IFR hours per ATCO in OPS




Figure 24: Ratio of frontline service staff to ATCO in OPS

The 2021 median ratio of frontline service staff to ATCO in OPS was 0.73. The same ANSPs that submitted oceanic data for 2020, also provided this data for 2021; for comparison the 2020 median was 0.72.

For the Ratio of Frontline Service Staff to ATCO in OPS, NAV CANADA had the largest increase during their reporting period at 25 per cent, likely due to staff cuts during the reporting period as mentioned earlier in the report. Isavia ANS' operations were dominated by oceanic flights (90 per cent), and therefore the ratio of frontline support staff is relatively high compared to other ANSPs, whose continental operations represent a larger proportion of their total service.

There are no CAGR data points for this KPI because ANSPs have been submitting frontline service staff data only since 2018.

# JOINT CONTINENTAL AND OCEANIC COST EFFICIENCY: 2021




Figure 25: Cost per IFR flight hour

The 2021 median cost per IFR flight hour was USD 789. The 2021 weighted average (considering total continental and oceanic IFR flight hours per ANSP) cost per IFR flight hour was USD 579. The 2020 median was USD 938 and the weighted average was USD 652 (2020 including the data from EANA and JANS which are not a part of 2021 submissions).




Figure 26: Employment cost of ATCOS in OPS as a per centage of total costs

The 2021 median employment cost of ATCOs in OPS as a per centage of total costs was 29 per cent. The same ANSPs that submitted oceanic data for 2020, also provided this data for 2021; for comparison the 2020 median was 29 per cent.

## SUMMARY OF PERFORMANCE TRENDS

#### **KEY FINDINGS**

- Disparity between performance trends of continental and oceanic ANSPs;
- Cost efficiency and ATCO productivity, specifically of continental ANSPs, are slowly improving and show signs of returning to pre-pandemic as traffic began to rise:
- Accelerated increases in ATCO employment costs per ATCO hour compared to those recorded in the previous year's continue;
- The majority of continental ANSPs reported a reduction in both total costs and costs excluding ATCO in OPS employment costs per IFR flight hour.

In 2021, the ANS performance and data are still being heavily impacted by the pandemic, with aircraft movements being 15 per cent below the 2019 levels. The low traffic levels at the beginning of the year had a negative impact on all key indicators. However, leading into the mid-year, most markets demonstrated some limited growth, resulting in slightly improved cost efficiency and productivity indicators for continental ANSPs while declining performance continued for oceanic ANSPs.

Analysis presented in the *Impact of COVID-19 on 2021 Performance* highlighted the impact of different fiscal and reporting periods that ANSPs use. As a result, the performance data of those ANSPs with reporting periods running from the second half of 2020 and those running into the first quarter of 2022 may be differently impacted by the recovery from the pandemic and shift towards more 'normal' traffic levels.

#### **COST EFFICIENCY**

In terms of cost efficiency, only five ANSPs experienced an increase in cost per IFR flight hour, compared to 99 per cent in 2020 and 60 per cent in 2019, when comparing the same set of ANSPs. With a slight increase in IFR traffic the Total cost per IFR flight hour in Continental airspace decreased by 17.4 per cent compared to 2020. On the contrary, the Total cost per IFR flight hour in Oceanic airspace increased by 20.4 per cent compared to 2020.

#### **PRODUCTIVITY**

The 41 ANSPs reported an increase in their ATCO productivity, compared to 98 per cent experiencing a decrease in productivity in 2020. When comparing the same set of ANSPs, the ATCO productivity of continental ANSPs increased by 16.7 per cent (2020-2021), while oceanic ANSPs saw a productivity decrease of 39.8 per cent.

## **FUTURE PERFORMANCE**

The operations during pandemic recovery and after, remain a challenge for the whole ATM system. Such recovery of ATCO productivity and cost efficiency should materialise in a sustainable manner by incorporating solutions fostering resilience of ANSPs to future changes in traffic demand.

The year 2019 will be regularly referred to as a reference year for normal traffic levels. However, it must be kept in mind that, as shown in the report from 2020, slowing traffic growth in 2019 resulted in several of the key trends from previous years being reversed.

# RELATED CANSO BENCHMARKING ACTIVITIES

CANSO conducts a variety of benchmarking exercises to examine developments in the industry. Combining these allow for a greater understanding of the current initiatives and trends occurring across the aviation industry, contextualizing the ANS performance analysis within this report. The following input has kindly been provided by the CANSO Safety Intelligence Work Group (SIWG).

#### CANSO SAFETY INTELLIGENCE WORK GROUP

The CANSO SIWG champions safety measurement and continuous improvement of safety performance. Consisting of representatives from ANSPs across the globe, this group works to analyse, advise, and advance safety performance measurement, and reports to the global<sup>9</sup> CANSO Safety Forum.

#### SAFETY PERFORMANCE

Safety is critical for the trust and confidence of the flying public. As a result, CANSO measures key safety performance indicators to contribute to improvements in safety and efficiency of air traffic control. When productivity and cost efficiency are measured, it becomes crucial to measure safety benchmarks, which rely on the interdependencies these three facets represent. Improvements in productivity and cost efficiency should never come at the cost of reduced safety.

Safety and safety performance are measured in several ways, both through proactive indicators of the CANSO Standard of Excellence (SoE) in Safety Management Systems (SMS) and event-based indicators of loss of separation and runway incursions.

This ensures that globally, ATM stakeholders understand how today safety performance drives tomorrow's improvements – inspiring CANSO members to be future-focused.

Note: Results from the CANSO Standard of Excellence in Safety Management Systems have been omitted from this report. In the spirit of collaboration, the SMS Maturity results should not be used to showcase performance in an external setting. The assessment is meant to drive internal efforts to improve areas of an ANSP's SMS that are found to be lacking, as well as to encourage the adoption of world leading practices. Any comparison with other ANSPs should be made for this purpose only. Unfortunately, a small number of ANSPs have extended the use of the results outside of this intended scope. Through productive discussions we are hopeful these challenges will be corrected, and results can be provided in the next edition.

## ATM GROUND IFR-IFR LOSSES OF SEPARATION<sup>10</sup>

A loss of separation is a key performance indicator for assuring compliance with applicable separation standards. This measure focuses on IFR-IFR losses (both aircraft flying under instrument flight rules).

There are multiple measures for safety performance, CANSO has prioritised this measure over others as a benchmark based on the risk profiling around potential loss of life.

In 2021, 24 ANSPs submitted data on IFR-IFR losses of separation. The total number of reported ATM Ground IFR-IFR losses of separation was 426. Putting it into


perspective, this represents 0.007 per cent of the traffic managed by participating ANSPs. The 99.993 per cent of traffic was managed without a loss of separation between two IFR aircraft.

The annual average rate for these ANSPs was 65.45 IFR-IFR losses of separation per one million IFR flight hours and 2.65 per 100,000 IFR flights.

There were six reported losses considered as high severity in the Risk Analysis Took (RAT) classification scheme<sup>11</sup>, which differs from the ICAO runway incursion severity classification. The RAT severity classification describes the impact of hazards incurred on the safety of flight operations. It combines the level of loss of separation and the degree of ability to recover from a hazardous situation. The overall severity of one occurrence is composed of the risk of collision/proximity determined by the achieved separation and rate of closure, and the degree of controllability over the incident or, in other words, the effectiveness of tactical barrier management.

55 per cent of all losses occurred in the Terminal environment and 26 per cent in enRoute. The remaining 19 per cent were not provided for analysis.

From the graph below, 45.6 per cent of the IFR-IFR losses of separation had the lowest RAT severity (E).

E	An incident which has no safety significance.
D	Insufficient information was available to determine the risk involved or inconclusive or conflicting evidence precluded such determination.

#### **RUNWAY INCURSIONS**


A high proportion of safety events take place around the vicinity of an airport's runway(s). Again, there are multiple measurements for safety around an aerodrome. Here, CANSO has selected to measure runway incursions due to the increased likelihood that an ANSP may have contributed to the event.

In 2021, 23 ANSPs submitted data on runway incursions. The total number of reported occurrences was 1,023 out of over 15.5 million runway movements, representing 0.007 per cent of the traffic managed by participating ANSPs. Eleven per cent of runway incursions were assessed as primarily attributed to the ANSPs, which equates to 0.0007 per cent of traffic.

The average 2021 rate of runway incursions for the ANSPs who submitted data was 7.22 RIs per 100,000 runway movements, or one runway incursion for every 14,000 take offs and landings. The rate of ATC-Attributed runway incursions was 0.71, or one in 140,000 take offs and landings.

Below are graphs summarizing the attribution (the primary causal element) and the severity based on the ICAO classification scheme. It is worth noting that most runway incursions were attributed to pilot deviation. No explanatory details are available for analysis which opens opportunities for further collaboration across industry partners.

Events assessed at ICAO runway incursion severities A and B contribute to about 3 per cent of all runway incursions regardless of attribution.






Figure 29: Runway incursion primary attribution distribution

Α	A serious incident in which a collision is narrowly avoided.
В	An incident in which separation decreases and there is significant potential for collision, which may result in a time-critical corrective/evasive response to avoid a collision.
С	An incident characterised by ample time and/or distance to avoid a collision.
D	An incident that meets the definition of a runway incursion such as the incorrect presence of a vehicle, person, or aircraft on the protected area of a surface designated for the landing and take-off of aircraft but with no immediate safety consequences.
Е	Insufficient information, or inconclusive or conflicting evidence precludes a severity assessment.

NAV Portugal was the group leader for Annual employment cost per ATCO in OPS at 327K USD, around 100K USD more than Isavia ANS. Again, for Annual working hours per ATCO in OPS, NAV Portugal was the CG leader at 1,863. Annual IFR hours per ATCO in OPS reached 1.2K, far below Isavia ANS.









Total costs (USD) in 2021 for PANSA decreased by 19.9% during the year, with ATCO costs providing the biggest decrease of 34.3%. IFR flight hours showed growth for PANSA in 2021, increasing by 23.0%, however these remained 47.7% lower than in 2019. ATCO hours remained consistent at 0.45M, however these also remained below 2019 levels by 28.2%.








Comparing PANSA with other ANSPs in Comparator Group 2, PANSA had a Total costs per IFR flight hour (637 USD) very close to CG median value of 634.4 USD. ATCO in OPS hour productivity (IFR flight hours per ATCO in OPS hours) of PANSA was higher than the CG's median at 0.61.

PANSA's ATCO in OPS cost per ATCO in OPS hour was 112.5 USD.





The Annual employment cost per ATCO in OPS for PANSA in 2021 was 87K USD, relatively close to the median for the CG. Annual working hours per ATCO in OPS for PANSA were the lowest of the CG at 770. PANSA's Annual IFR hours per ATCO in OPS were close to the CG's median, rising 23% on 2020 values to 467.







Slovenia Control's ATCO in OPS cost per ATCO in OPS hour was 115.0 USD, the median of the CG.









SMATSA's total costs for 2021 reduced by roughly 3.1% in comparison to 2020 figures, with ATCO costs accounting for 26.0% of total costs during 2021. Whilst IFR flight hours showed growth for SMATSA in 2021, increasing by 35.7%, this still remained 50.5% below 2019 levels. ATCO hours returned to 2019 levels through a growth of 21.8% year on year.






Comparing SMATSA with other ANSPs in Comparator Group 2, SMATSA had one of the lowest Total costs per IFR flight hours for the CG at 622.0 USD, slightly under the CG median. For ATCO in OPS hour productivity, SMATSA was narrowly below the CG's median at 0.41.

In ATCO in OPS cost per ATCO in OPS hour, SMATSA had one of the median figures at 67.1 USD.





Annual employment cost per ATCO in OPS for SMATSA was one of the CG's lowest figures at 77.5K USD, similar to PANSA. Annual working hours per ATCO in OPS were below the CG's median value (1.3K), growing 23% to 1,154. SMATSA was just below the CG's median for Annual IFR hours per ATCO in OPS, giving 0.5K for the year.

## **ANNEX 1: METHODOLOGY**

#### MEASURING PERFORMANCE

Cost efficiency and productivity are two key indicators of measuring the performance of air navigation service provision. They demonstrate how ANSPs are delivering value and serve as indicators of operational efficiency. These KPIs are all part of the CANSO ANS Performance Framework.

#### **COST EFFICIENCY**

Cost efficiency provides an indication of the balance between operational effectiveness (i.e. ATCO productivity) and the cost of providing the service.

The simplest indicator of cost efficiency is the cost of providing ANS services per IFR flight hour. A lower cost per flight hour, however, is not necessarily indicative of greater overall performance.

Economic differences outside of the control of ANSPs can drive differences in costs. This includes labour contracts, salary scales and working conditions (such as hours), as well as government regulations on pension management and mandatory financial controls. Furthermore, ANSPs do not control the volume of traffic, which is a function of economic activity and other air passenger demands. Where a minimum level of service is required, there is a limit to how activities can be scaled down in response to lower demand. This was particularly evident in 2021, the year considered in this report.

Cost indicators do not reflect external factors, other performance areas or the quality of service. Moreover, there are costs associated with providing a safer and more punctual, predictable, and efficient service, which can deliver savings to air operators flying in the airspace that offset higher ANSP costs.

Costs are broken down into ATCOs in OPS employment and other costs. Other costs include operating costs (excluding ATCO in OPS employment costs), depreciation/amortisation and costs of capital related to providing ATC/ATFM services. They do not include MET costs.

### **PRODUCTIVITY**

The key indicator of ANS productivity is IFR flight hours per ATCO in OPS hour, often described as 'ATCO in OPS productivity'.

Although generally reflective of ANSPs' performance, factors beyond the control of the ANSP can cause low levels of productivity – for example a geopolitical event that alters traffic demand.

ATCO in OPS productivity is driven by traffic levels and an ANSP's ability to utilise its ATCOs in operations (OPS) resources. Although they cannot affect traffic demand, ANSPs may improve productivity by utilising flexible rostering and adapting airspace configuration to open and close sectors according to evolving traffic patterns.

Furthermore, advances in technology are now focusing more than ever on reducing the workload of ATCOs in OPS to enable them to safely manage higher levels of traffic in a given volume of airspace. Training associated with the introduction of technology, however, can lead to short-term reductions in productivity.

Airspace complexity also affects ATCO in OPS productivity. Lower airspace will typically have lower levels of ATCO in OPS productivity than upper airspace where aircraft are flying at more consistent altitudes and on non-crossing routes. Therefore, an ANSP operating a high proportion of sectors in lower airspace, or with numerous busy airports with complex approach sectors, is likely to have lower ATCO in OPS productivity than an ANSP with more overflights at higher altitude.

#### DATA PROCESSING

**Data collection:** ANSPs who are members of the CANSO GBWG provided data for this analysis. ANSPs either submit the minimum dataset required for participation in the report (the basic data), or additional data to inform the analysis of advanced KPIs (the advanced data).

ANSPs can also revise data submitted in previous years. The data submission workbook includes validation calculations that ANSPs are encouraged to consult in the data collection phase.

The entire dataset is available to all participating ANSPs to enable closer analysis and evaluation of performance trends. The advanced KPI dataset is only available to ANSPs submitting advanced data.

2021 performance data for European ANSPs has been kindly provided by EUROCONTROL, alongside data for the years 2017 – 2021 to facilitate historical trends analysis, which are completed with the extended set of ANSPs to ensure validity of any trend analysis. European ANSP members of the CANSO GBWG, who also submit data to EUROCONTROL have their ACE data used in this analysis, unless otherwise agreed.

It should be noted that Indicator 2B 'ATCO productivity' is not directly comparable to the ATCO productivity KPI used in the ACE report. This is because the *CANSO ANS Performance Framework* uses IFR flight hours to calculate this KPI, rather than composite flight hours as used in the ACE report ATCO productivity KPI.

Finally, as part of the data sharing agreement with EUROCONTROL, CANSO data is only available to the core EUROCONTROL analysts and is not shared with the wider ACE report ANSP community.

Data Dashboard: As part of the CANSO 2017-2021 data collection cycle, a PowerBi dashboard was produced in November 2022, which allowed CANSO members a first look at trends in their data. This dashboard and accompanying underlying data document provided members the opportunity to thoroughly review and validate their data submission and notify Egis of any amendments if necessary.

**Data processing:** Data has been processed by Egis subject to a data processing agreement with CANSO and in accordance with European data privacy laws. It was subject to a one-step quality check for significant changes, potential errors or omissions and is subject to continued revision by participating ANSPs.

**Separation of continental and oceanic data:** Information is provided both for continental and oceanic air navigation services, where applicable. Each of these environments has different challenges associated with providing ANS. For example, it is more straightforward to provide ground infrastructure for communications and surveillance services in continental airspace than it is over oceans.

**Exchange rate conversion:** ANSPs submit data in their chosen currency. For KPI comparison, data is presented in USD. KPI Data for 2021 is converted using exchange rates provided by each ANSP or using data available from the Organisation for

Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) website. Exchange rates for some countries are unavailable using OECD; International Monetary Fund (IMF) exchange rates have been used in such situations.

For ANSPs that operate in a currency other than the USD, the assumption of lower cost may be caused in part by the strengthening USD. Between 2015 and 2016, the USD appreciated against most other world currencies, meaning each USD buys more foreign currency. Despite a dip in 2017, the USD once again strengthened in 2018. This change in the relative value of the dollar effectively lowers the price that ANSPs incur in USD.

**Growth rates:** Data is presented from 2021 and then for the one-year and four-year trends. The trend over four years is calculated as the compound annual growth rate (four-year CAGR). This shows the overall trend between 2017 and 2021 but masks the fluctuations that may have taken place over the intervening years. In addition, if 2017 was an outlier, this trend may not be representative of the trend over this timeframe. Individual ANSP results for Four-Year CAGR should therefore be interpreted alongside contextual information.

The trend analysis is presented above the 2021 KPI data and is based on the data submitted in the ANSP's chosen currency.

**Inflation:** The growth rates are not adjusted for inflation, and local inflation rates should therefore be considered when interpreting CAGR trends.

**PPP correction:** Salaries and the cost of living vary extensively around the world. One way to correct for this is by using purchasing power parity (PPP). Employment costs for ATCOs in OPS are corrected using IMF data. There are, of course, limitations to this approach, as the cost of living can vary widely within a country and may be higher or lower in the region where ANS offices are located.

Median: The median is the middle number of the data set.

Q1 and Q3: The first quartile (Q1) is defined as the middle number between the smallest number and the median of the data set. The third quartile (Q3) is the middle value between the median and the highest value of the data set.

# ANNEX 3: KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

The detailed metrics for determining the cost efficiency and productivity of continental and oceanic air navigation services are set out in Figure 35. These performance indicators are derived from the CANSO ANS Performance Framework.

### DETERMINING PERFORMANCE METRICS

The CANSO ANS Performance Framework was established to create common performance indicators for global ANS data. Based on a tiered structure, the framework was developed in 2014 by the CANSO Global Benchmarking Workgroup (GBWG). It aims to demonstrate the drivers of cost efficiency.




Figure 32: CANSO ANS performance framework

Over the years, the GBWG has worked to identify alternative KPIs to investigate the drivers of the KPIs in the framework, in particular KPI 2C. In 2020, KPI 3D was added to the framework to better understand the proportion of 'frontline service support staff' to ATCO in OPS in an ANSP.

It is important to note the dependence of the higher tier metrics on the lower tier. This can be established as follows:

In addition, traffic was also affected by the eruption of the Cumbre Vieja volcano on the island of La Palma in September 2021, causing, among other things, traffic deviations that especially affected the KEA indicator in the airspace of the Canary Islands.
